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INTRODUCTION

This booklet provides helpful information on the wide variety of long term support services offered to seniors in Tompkins County. These support services and living arrangements comprise the long term care network that enables seniors to live safely and comfortably throughout their lives.

In general, these services are either in-home or residential. It is important to investigate and discuss options with family and friends in order to make the best choices.

Both public and private agencies provide medical and social assistance. Seniors may only require services such as home delivered meals or they may need the complete medical and therapeutic services of a long term care facility. All the housing arrangements described in this booklet are licensed to provide service.



A companion booklet called *Housing for Seniors In Tompkins County* describes in more detail the various housing options provided in Tompkins County. Another booklet, titled *Resources for Caregivers in Tompkins County*, gives more detailed information about services to support caregivers. These booklets are available at the Tompkins County Office for the Aging along with other booklets in this series listed on the inside front cover.

IN-HOME ASSISTANCE

Public Programs Providing Assessment and In-Home Care Services

Tompkins Care Connection (*formerly Long Term Care Services*)

Tompkins Care Connection (TCC) is the “point of entry” for long term care services in Tompkins County. TCC provides information, referral, assessment and case management at no cost to Tompkins County residents with long term care needs. TCC also administers publicly-funded in-home care services:

- 1. Assessment** - Any Tompkins County resident can request a home assessment to help them determine their care needs. TCC provides assistance with nursing home placement including the State-mandated Patient Review Instrument (PRI).
- 2. EISEP** (Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program) provides non-medical, in-home services and case management for people 60 and over who can be cared for safely at home. Home care services include help with bathing, dressing, cooking, shopping, laundry, and housekeeping. The case manager will arrange for and monitor these services to make sure they are meeting the client’s needs. Clients pay for services on a sliding fee scale based on their income and housing expenses. There is no charge for case management.
- 3. Medicaid Home Care** provides a variety of home care services to Medicaid clients. Medical need must be documented by a physician. Caseworkers and nurses, under a doctor’s order, jointly coordinate personal care services to people who receive Medicaid. Services are provided without regard to age.

The **Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program (CDPAP)** provides the same services as a personal care aide in the Medicaid program, however, the consumer is responsible for hiring, scheduling and designing the care plan.

Long Term Home Health Care Program

The **Long Term Home Health Care Program (LTHHCP)** is funded by Medicaid to provide coordinated home care services to recipients who are otherwise medically eligible for care in an institutionalized setting. Services provided are nursing, medical, social services, home care aides, nutrition, medical supplies and equipment, and all other therapeutic and related services. This program is sometimes called Nursing Home Without Walls.

Three Eligibility Criteria:

1. Financial - must not exceed the same income and asset limits for Medicaid payment of nursing home care.
2. Safe Care Plan - a home visit by a nurse and social worker will determine whether LTHHCP “waivered service” is necessary and whether adequate care can safely be provided
3. Cost of Care - must fit within the LTHHCP budget cap (75% of the cost of care in a skilled nursing facility)

Home Care Employment Registry

The Registry is a free listing and referral service that lists households needing in-home help. The Registry links these households with independent job seekers over the age of 18. In-home job seekers are listed after they are interviewed and their references are checked. People hired for in-home care are employees of the household. The Registry may suggest an average wage, but work arrangements and fees must be worked out between the family and the worker. The Registry lists jobs for personal care aides, cleaning personnel, companions, homemakers and nurses. Wages for home health aides and personal care aides tend to range from \$10 to \$15 per hour, while housekeeping and companions tend to be in the \$8 to \$12 range. However agreed-upon wages can vary widely.

There is no fee for the matching service but contributions are welcomed.

Home Care and Home Health Care Agencies

Home Care and Home Health Care Services are offered by the agencies listed in the following pages. Services may also be privately arranged. Home care may be scheduled as needed from several hours per week to 24 hours a day. Costs vary depending on the agency and the services performed. Generally, home care is provided by:

Registered Nurse (RN) Licensed by the State of New York to do specific medical care.

Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) Licensed by the State of New York to do a lower level of medical care.

Home Health Aide (HHA) - Trained to provide medical-related services and personal care such as bathing/dressing.

Personal Care Aide (PCA) - Provides personal care such as bathing, grooming assistance, and meal preparation.

Homemaker/Companion - Assists with home management activities such as meal preparation, housekeeping, shopping, companion visits or escorting, running errands, etc.

Hiring someone to provide care in the home, either from an agency or privately, is an individual decision. Home care agencies are responsible for training, scheduling, supervising, arranging for substitutes, and employee benefits for personnel they employ. (When a family makes an employment agreement directly with the caregiver, its members assume these responsibilities.)



Payment is made by the family, a third party such as Medicaid, Medicare, or an insurance company.

CareGivers

CareGivers is a State Licensed Home Health Care Agency. CareGivers provides Nurses, Home Health Aides, Personal Care Aides and Companion services, from 2 hours per day, once a week to 24 hours per day, 7 days a week. All services are supervised by a Registered Nurse, who does an initial patient assessment and ongoing evaluations at no additional charge.

Classen Home Health Associates, Inc.

Classen Home Health is a home care agency offering 24 hour a day Home Health Aide services and providing assistance with personal care needs. They will also prepare meals, do laundry and perform light housekeeping. Also included in their services are routine visits by a registered nurse who will monitor health and perform blood pressure checks. If necessary a registered nurse will accompany the client to medical appointments and will act as a liaison to the physician.

Classen Home Health Aide rate is \$19.50/hour. Generally a minimum of three hours per visit.

Comfort Keepers

Comfort Keepers is a licensed home care agency. Their home health aides can provide assistance with personal care needs as well as meal preparation, laundry, light housekeeping and running errands. Companion services provide non-medical services such as companionship, meals, transportation services, and other in home services. Companion service is available from 2-24 hours/day including the possibility of live-in service.

Family & Children's Service

Family and Children's Service, a licensed, not-for-profit home care services agency, offers home health care through Home Health Aides and Personal Care Aides. The agency contracts with Tompkins County Home Health Care and Hospicare to provide home health care services.

Private care is available from the agency at the personal care level and home health aide level. Nursing assessments are also available. There is an additional charge for holiday service.

The agency also offers Respite Care and the services of an in-home caregiver counselor with funding from the United Way and Community Reinvestment Funds. (See p. 19 for more information.) Contributions are voluntary for both programs.

Medicare-certified Home Health Agencies

Note: The following two agencies are certified by Medicare to provide Medicare-paid home health care. Medicare only pays for home health care when the doctor prescribes what Medicare considers “skilled medical care” in the home such as physical therapy, speech therapy, and or medical services provided by a nurse. The patient must also be consider homebound by Medicare’s definition.

Hospicare and Palliative Care Services

Hospicare and Palliative Care Services is a program of comprehensive home care for terminally-ill patients and their families. The program includes home care services, emotional, psychological and spiritual support to the patient and to family members, respite services, financial and legal counseling, and provision of medical supplies, drugs and equipment. Bereavement services are open to the community.

The Hospicare Residence provides residential care for terminally ill patients and is located in the **Hospice Center** on a 12.5 acre site. It has six private rooms, a fully-equipped kitchen for individual meals, an adjacent private living and dining area, whirlpool tub and meditation room.

MEAL AND SHOPPING SERVICES

Congregate Meals Program (Foodnet)

The **Congregate Meals Program** is provided by **Foodnet**, a not-for-profit group that contracts with the Tompkins County Office for the Aging to operate the nutrition programs for the county. They provide meals and social time Monday through Friday at midday. Nutrition counseling and education is also provided. The sites for meals are conveniently located throughout the county, and are open to everyone over 60. A donation of \$3.00 is suggested for each meal, and food stamps are also accepted, but no one is denied a meal because of inability to make a donation.

Meals on Wheels

Foodnet provides Meals on Wheels (home-delivered meals) to people in Tompkins County who are homebound and unable to prepare their own meals. A hot meal and optional sandwich meal are delivered five days a week, and frozen meals can be provided for the weekends. Nutrition education and counseling are available from the Registered Dietitian.

Eligibility

1. Senior Nutrition Program: Persons age 60 and over are eligible to receive meals on wheels if they are homebound and incapacitated due to accident, illness or frailty; lack adequate support of family friends or neighbors; and are unable to prepare meals because of any one of the following:

- Lack of facilities such as refrigeration, stove, etc.
- Inability to shop and cook for self
- Inability to safely prepare meals
- Lack of knowledge and skills

2. The spouse of the homebound person, regardless of age or condition, is eligible to receive meals on wheels when the provision of a meal to the spouse is in the best interest of the homebound person.

3. Non-elderly disabled individuals who reside in a non-institutional household with a person eligible to receive meals on wheels may also receive this service when the provision of the meal to the non-elderly disabled individual is in the best interest of the homebound elderly person.

Cost

Meals for eligible persons under items 1-3 above are partially funded by the Tompkins County Office for the Aging and the New York State Office for the Aging. Suggested contributions are \$3 per hot meal and \$4 for a sandwich and hot meal, but no one will be denied meals because of inability to pay. Food stamp vouchers may be used in lieu of a cash contribution.

4. **Foodnet Select:** Other persons under age 60 are eligible to receive meals on wheels under the criteria listed in #1 above provided they purchase the meals under the Foodnet Select program or arrange for a third party to pay for the meals on their behalf. Tompkins County and Foodnet established the **Foodnet Select** program with no state or federal funding in order to make Meals on Wheels available to more people and to help offset reductions in government grants. The **fee** is \$6 per hot meal, \$7 for a sandwich and hot meal. **Payment** for Foodnet Select meals must be made in advance unless special arrangements are made to bill a third party.

Food Shopping Services

The **Food Shopping Program of the Southside Community Center** grocery shopping is for senior citizens who live within the Northside and Southside neighborhoods of Ithaca and who are unable to shop for themselves.

Clients call in their orders to the Southside Community Center by Tuesday night and shopping is done on Wednesdays and Thursdays and delivered to the client. Shopping and delivery are free so clients only pay for their food. Food stamps are accepted.

In-Home Caregiver Counseling/Consultation

The Home Care Program of Family and Children's Service offers confidential consultation and support, at home or in the office, to caregivers and their families who would like the help provided by a professional in the field of caregiving. There is no charge for this service which is supported by United Way and Community Reinvestment Act funds. Contributions are requested to expand the service. (*See contact information below for the Home Care Program.*)

In-Home Respite Care Options

The Respite Program of Family and Children's Service provides trained home health aides for homebound persons over the age of 60 as well as others with mental health issues. This grant-funded service is provided for an average of three hours per week per client and enables caregivers to take some "time-off" from the responsibilities of caring for a physically or emotionally dependent person. Respite services are usually offered between noon and 5 pm weekdays. There is no charge for this service. Contributions are accepted.

Privately hired Respite Services

For a fee, you may arrange for respite aide service through one of several area agencies if they have aides available at the times you need one (*See pages 8-12*). You may also be able to hire someone privately through **The Registry**, a service of the Women's Opportunity Center (*see page 7*).

Out-of-Home Respite Care Services

Adult Homes

Short-term stays are allowed on a space-available basis in **Clare Bridge** (for dementia patients), **Sterling House, Bridges Cornell Heights**, as well as most of the smaller, **family-type, adult care homes** locally (see page 32-33). You may also want to look at places in nearby counties (e.g., Walden Place in Cortlandville, 756-8101, Ariel's in Candor, 659-3644). Charges generally include meals, housekeeping, help with bath and medications, and recreational programming. Respite residents must have enough self-care skills to qualify for residential care.

Overnight Respite with Nursing Care

Those who do not have self-care skills to qualify for an adult home level of care can consider two other options for overnight respite:

Lakeside Nursing Home and Beachtree Care Center

Both accept short term admissions for respite purposes on a space-available basis. A nursing home assessment and doctor's orders are needed. Contact the nursing home a few days before the date respite care is needed (*see pages 35-36*).

TRANSPORTATION

FISH Transportation Service

FISH volunteers provide essential transportation within Tompkins County for elderly, handicapped, or low-income individuals. This service is offered primarily for medically-related trips. It is best to call several days in advance (48 hours or more) in order to schedule transportation. Although there is no charge for this service, donations are accepted.

Gadabout Transportation Service

Gadabout provides demand-response transportation in Tompkins County to people 60 or over, and those with a disability. Most of its vehicles are wheelchair-lift equipped. Reservations two or more days ahead of time. Trips can be for any purpose, with priority given to medical and nutritional necessities.

Fare is \$1.50 one way within the city limits and \$2.00 one way outside of the city limits. Most of Gadabout's drivers are volunteers who have been trained and tested.

ADA Paratransit Service

The ADA Paratransit Service is specialized transportation geared to serve the needs of individuals who qualify under the Americans with Disabilities Act. Persons with disabilities which prevent them from riding a public bus are eligible. Prerequisites for qualifying include completion of an application from the ADA Paratransit Service, and one interview.

Those who qualify will receive a card allowing them to use the service, which covers a 3/4 mile-wide corridor on either side of regular bus routes, and operates within the same time frame as the public bus service. For further information, or schedules, routes, and fares, contact:

Airport Limousine Service

Senior Citizens can be picked up by the airport limousine and be taken to doctor's appointments in downtown Syracuse at the Medicaid rate (a discounted rate). The limousine stops in the downtown area and goes on to the Syracuse airport to pickup clients there. It will not go out of the way to outlying areas of the city. Call ahead of time to arrange for pick-up at your home. Be sure to identify yourself as a "County Office for the Aging client" and ask for the reduced rate.

ADDITIONAL LONG TERM CARE SERVICES

Project CARE

Project CARE, organized by the Tompkins County Office for the Aging, matches older people with volunteers and encourages regular visits. Project CARE volunteers also can provide a needed break from caregiving and other assistance to family caregivers. For the older adult, Project CARE offers companionship and a chance for sharing time and interests. Students from several area colleges as well as year-round members of the community often volunteer and look forward to this social connection.

Volunteers might also assist with errands, light housekeeping or yard work. In some instances, Project CARE volunteers free up a family caregiver who is having difficulty finding time to take a break or attend to other responsibilities. Typically volunteers visit about two hours a week. Individual arrangements may vary.

Legal Assistance Program

Through a contract with the Office for the Aging, the Neighborhood Legal Service provides free legal advice on civil matters to Tompkins County residents age 60 or older. The **Legal Assistance Program** gives priority to those individuals with the greatest social or economic needs. Legal problems that are given high priority include establishing a power-of-attorney; rights of nursing home residents; social security, SSI, Medicare and Medicaid appeals; landlord/ tenant problems. Fee-generating and criminal cases are excluded by law. No fees are charged for program services. Voluntary contributions are used to expand the service.

Personal Emergency Response System (PERS)

The Personal Emergency Response System is a communication system which links an individual with the county's emergency medical response system. Pressing a button on the unit or on a pendant worn around the neck automatically dials an emergency rescue dispatcher. The system tests itself every 24 hours. This system provides around-the-clock protection, even if the person is unable to use the telephone.

The Office for the Aging Outreach Worker will make a home visit to demonstrate the system and determine how and where the equipment should be installed. PERS units are rented on a sliding scale depending upon income. Contact:

Protective Services for Adults

Protective Services are provided to adults over the age of 18 who, because of physical or mental impairment, are unable to manage their own resources or protect themselves from neglect or hazardous situations, and have no one able to help them. Services are available regardless of income level, and include prompt response and assessment and arranging or providing other services including social, medical, legal, mental health or in-home services.

If necessary, the Department of Social Services can serve as a representative payee for a person unable to manage her or his money. Referrals come from concerned individuals as well as agencies and people themselves. Referrals are confidential.

Equipment ranges from small items (kitchen aids, phone amplifiers, devices to assist in dressing, bathing, medications management, bathroom safety equipment, etc) to larger items (portable ramps, wheelchairs, walkers, canes, braille machines, etc.) FLIC staff consult with persons with disabilities and their caregivers about accessibility issues, assistive equipment, ramp installation, and local resources to support people with vision, hearing, mobility and other physical limitations. Tompkins Care Connection and Adult Protective Services

Wide range of services is available to individuals over the age of 18 who meet certain criteria. These services aim to maintain people in the community and maximize their capacity for self-care.

Caseworkers can provide and coordinate services to promote effective functioning for an individual in the community. Such services may include: help with locating medical, drug and alcohol services, vocational rehabilitation, adult homes and other facilities, help with home management, budgeting and financial management, and homemaker services.

Some services are provided without regard to income, while others are based on income level or Medicaid eligibility. Protective services are provided without regard to income.
